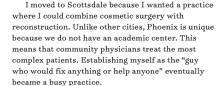

Even after over 5,000 surgeries, I'm still amazed by the transformation that occurs with a scalpel and suture. Improving someone's self-confidence or rebuilding them is very satisfying.
